March 10th to 12th 2022


IFS organised the event once again online. The conference brings together students from international schools in Asia to discuss topical and current world issues.

Live Talk with Heïdi Sevestre

April 7th 2022

We were thrilled to host a fascinating live discussion with renowned glaciologist and science communication manager Dr Heïdi Sevestre. As a key figure in the field of climate research and a dedicated advocate for action on the climate crisis, Dr Sevestre brought a wealth of expertise and passion to the conversation.

Previously serving as the Project Coordinator for Arctic Monitoring and Assessment Programme (AMAP), one of the working groups of the Arctic Council, Dr Sevestre, played a pivotal role in understanding the impact of climate change on Arctic ecosystems. Additionally, she taught glaciology at The University Center in Svalbard, situated in the High Arctic.

Dr Sevestre's commitment to making scientific data more accessible was genuinely inspiring. She sought to bridge the gap between scientific research and public understanding through her work with the Swedish-American non-government organization, International Cryosphere Climate Initiative. Dr Sevestre aimed to motivate action to combat the climate crisis by creating awareness and fostering engagement.

We were honoured to have Dr Sevestre join us live from the mesmerizing Spitzbergen archipelago, located beyond the Arctic Circle, where she was on a mission. This unique setting provided a firsthand perspective on the impact of climate change and the urgent need for collective action.

During this exclusive event, Dr Sevestre shared her insights, experiences, and latest findings in the field of glaciology. Students, parents, educators, and climate enthusiasts came together for this exceptional opportunity to engage with a leading expert in climate research.

Those who attended this insightful conversation gained a deeper understanding of the importance of environmental stewardship and our role in shaping a sustainable future. The live talk with Dr Heïdi Sevestre, held on April 7th, 2022, sparked meaningful discussions and inspired attendees to take action.

A Singapore-based snack company Confetti Snacks is fighting the food sustainability battle by upcycling food waste from imperfect produce or crop surpluses into gourmet snacks.

The four IFS students worked as a team and had just two weeks to brainstorm, design and refine a strategy to support Confetti's goals. Like in a real-world consulting scenario, they were tasked to create a pitch book and present their solutions to a panel of jury members for evaluation.

Our students ranked second among the thirty-one participating teams thanks to great teamwork. They were happy to have been able to interact with other students from different countries and cultures, and all participants received a tree with EcoMatcher as a gift.



Sports: a New Bac Option


September 2022

1.4 IFS Campus Extension Project

In 2022, the IFS Executive Committee (Board) approved continuing the IFS Elementary and Kindergarten extension project, which had been previously postponed. With an estimated budget of SGD 80 million, this project aims to expand the school's capacity to accommodate 4,000 students from K1 to 12.

Scheduled for completion by mid-2025, the expansion encompasses several vital elements. These include a five-storey classroom block, an eight-storey Administration & Ancillary building, and three blocks of a three-storey building designed explicitly for the new kindergarten, which will be Singapore's first zero-energy kindergarten. The total newly constructed gross floor area is approximately 22,800 square meters. To ensure optimal convenience and minimise environmental impact, all new installations will be interconnected and seamlessly linked to existing facilities at the second storey, providing fully sheltered circulation throughout the campus. The Administration Block will house essential amenities such as a sports hall, a multi-purpose hall, a 350-seat auditorium, ancillary staff offices, and a staff recreation room with a roof terrace.

The new Kindergarten classrooms are organised into six self-sustainable clusters, each housed within the three blocks. Known as the Villa Concept, each cluster consists of four spacious classrooms, one language room, one teacher room, and a large central common area. This flexible common area serves as an open space to accommodate various learning experiences for students. The classrooms are equipped with oversized sliding glass doors, allowing for adaptable space planning to facilitate a wide range of activities within the cluster.

The new IFS Kindergarten, designed to achieve BCA Green Mark Platinum (Zero Energy) certification, will be a remarkable landmark in Singapore. This kindergarten integrates advanced green technologies, including rainwater harvesting systems, energy-efficient lighting, hybrid air-conditioning, and photovoltaic energy generation.

As the only zero-energy kindergarten of its kind in Singapore, it embodies the school's dedication to creating an environmentally conscious future.

3.1 Leadership



Governed by both an educational and an executive committee:

- The Educational Committee, headed by the Principal, examines everything that is related to school life, particularly teaching matters.
- The Executive Committee, headed by the President, oversees the management and long-term strategy of the School to the exclusion of purely pedagogical matters. All members are volunteers, they do not receive any financial compensation from the School for their activities. They are elected by the members of International French School (Singapore) during the Ordinary General Meeting. The Executive Committee represents the community of parents as well as the companies that hold Options de Fondateur (ODF).



3.2 The Executive Commitee

The Executive Committee (EC), manages the affairs and administration of the school, excluding the academic aspects. This committee is composed of 12 volunteer board members and up to 4 reserve members (from each group: Individual members and Corporate members) elected by the members of International French School (Singapore) during the Ordinary General Meeting in October or November. No Executive Committee member receives any remuneration for their services. The EC is in charge of the long-term strategy of the school.







The International French School (Singapore) (IFS) is incorporated in the Republic of Singapore and recognised under the Singapore Charities Act. A board that is made up of volunteers serving without remuneration governs the school. As a not-for-profit organisation, IFS channels any financial surplus towards the betterment of the school. Every dollar of school fee supports the delivery of our holistic learning programme, including staff recruitment and training, development and upkeep of facilities and most importantly, provision of teaching enablers and resources.

The school Board, elected by parents and the corporate members of the school, oversees the Executive Director in charge of support functions, including Finance. The Finance Director works under the direction of the Executive Director to implement the decisions of the Board and its committees and ensure that resources are managed efficiently and responsibly. School operations comply with best practices for financial accountability and transparency.

Charity Status - Reserve Policy

Overall, the total surplus amounted to 5.7M. Reserves are intended to ensure the school's sustainability and to be ready for financial impact from unexpected or uncontrollable events. The operating reserves provide a backstop in case of a decline in enrolment and underpin the long term facilities plan such as infrastructure upgrades, campus expansion and future lease renewal.


Due to this favourable surplus, IFS ended the year 2022 with reserves of 96M SGD. The healthy state of the school's finances reflects the continuous efforts of the Board and the Administration to maintain and improve the school's long term financial stability. The Management looks forward to an exciting future for the International French School (Singapore).

4.1 Revenues

We are pleased to report that our audited financial results for 2022 compare favourably to the 2022 budget, approved by the Executive Committee in December 2021.

The principal funding source of the International French School (Singapore) derives from the school fees. Revenue is higher than the budget due to school and registration fees from better enrolment. The school continues to pursue the international pathway to enhance its organic pipeline. There were, on average, 2870 students in 2022.

As a result, the 2022 turnover amounted to 67.9M, 2.1M more than 2021.




4.2 Expenditures

Operating expenses were lower than budgeted due to the constant focus on renegotiations of significant contracts and tight cost controls.


COVID-19 further contributed to this through events that had to be held virtually and unrealised school trips. However, the school spent significantly more on Health and Safety measures such as specialized disinfection of classrooms. The volatility of the energy market that surfaced in the last quarter of 2021, and went on throughout 2022, led to a distinct increase in electricity expenses.

Personnel costs, the school's main expense, were also lower mainly due to late recruitments, optimisation of our exchange policy and a moderate support from the Singapore government to help promote hiring of locals and seniors.



Our financial results for 2022 compare favourably to the budget, due to the higher revenues and lower expenses.
