
Cirque du Soleil: Kooza

Be pulled back to the ground as the SSO and Hans Graf explore the emotional gravity of the human condition through Elgar's heart-rending Cello Concerto, starring Austrian cellist Julia Hagen. 
But one day, something strange happens—a mighty burp ripples through his entire body, a vibration so powerful that he just has to collect it before it escapes!
